Fishman tells how this family, the Fisher family, is not your traditional, American mainstream family; they are a family of the Old Order Amish. Though schoolwork and education are overshadowed by house, field, and barn work, what literacy means to the family is still transmitted through many various ways. The different books, magazines, readings, text, writings, and articles littered around the house not only are works of literature, but they are also concerning their culture. So, as the children read, talked, and wrote, they learned their culture and literacy at the same time. This created a way to make literacy true to them as an Amish family versus an American, mainstream family.
